Rebellion

Rebel: *n.* American College Dictionary:

- 1. One who refuses allegiance to, resists, or rises in arms against, the established or rightful government or ruler.
- 2. One who or that which resists any authority or control.

Rebellion:

- 1. Open, organized, and armed resistance to one's government or ruler.
- 2. Resistance against or defiance of any authority or control.

Rebellious:

- 1. Defying lawful authority; insubordinate; disposed to rebel.
- 3. (Of things) resisting treatment.

Rebeldom:

- 1. region controlled by rebels.
- 2. Rebels collectively.

Rebel: n. Noah Webster's 1828

American Dictionary of the English Language:

- 1. One who revolts from the government to which he owes allegiance, either by openly renouncing the authority of that government, or by taking arms and openly opposing it. A *rebel* differs from an *enemy*, as the latter is one who does not owe allegiance to the government which he attacks. Num. 17 (II Ki.18:7; 24:1-2,19-20)
- 2. One who willfully violates a law. Encyclopedia
- 3. One who disobeys the kings proclamation; a contemner of the king's laws. *British Laws. Blachstone*.
- 4. A villain who disobeys his lord. Encyclopedia (2 Chr. 13:6)

Rebel: *v.i.* [L. *rebello*, to make war again; *re* and *bello*; *bel*, war] "Ye have built you an altar, that ye might *rebel* this day against the Lord." Joshua 22; Isaiah 1

Rebellion: [L. *rebellio*. Among the Romans, rebellion was originally a revolt or open resistance to their government by nations that had been suddued in war. It was a renewed war.]

1. An open and avowed renunciation of the authority of the government to which one owes allegiance; or the taking of arms traitorously to resist the authority of lawful government; revolt. *Rebellion* differs from *insurrection* and from *mutiny*.

Insurrection may be a rising in opposition to a particular act or law, without a design to renounce wholly all subjection to the government. *Mutiny* is an insurrection of soldiers or seamen against the authority of their officers.

Rebellion:

Rebellion is both a spirit and an attitude, and results in rebellious doctrines.

The most common way of rebellion -- don't listen! Ignore the instruction.

- Luke 23:14 Jesus is charged by the religious leaders of inciting the people to "rebellion" (NAS). "Perverteth" KJV (αποστρεφοντα, apostrephonta, from + turn, to turn back or away from, pervert)
- I Timothy 1:9 The law is made for the lawless and disobedient KJV (ανυποτακτοισ, an-upo-taktois, not + under + command, orders = unruly, insubordinate, rebellious NAS)
- Titus 1:6 An elder must have children who believe and are not accused of riot (ασωτιασ, asotias, no + salvation = dissolute, recklessly debauched, incorrigibleness) or unruly (an-upo-takta), but be blameless (free from all charge)!
- Titus 1:9-10 There are many contradictors (αντιλεγοντασ, anti-legontas, against + speak) and unruly (an-upo-taktoi) and vain talkers (ματαιολογοι, mataiologoi, empty + talk, means devoid of force, truth, success, result, purpose) and deceivers (φρεναπαται, phren-apatai, mind + deceive, mind-deceivers, mind-seductors) whose mouths must be stopped!
- Jude 1:11 Woe to those who have perished in the gainsaying (anti-logia, speak against; NAS, rebellion = speaking and acting against) of Korah.
