Isaiah 28:9-13

The following are a few important points that we need to understand concerning tongues.

A. There are three main ways that the gift of tongues operates. 1 Cor. 12:4-5

1st The gift of tongues is used most often for one to speak to God and not to man (1 Cor. 14:2). Many of the reasons to do so and references are given in the list above. The other two ways that the gift of tongues is used is for the purpose of giving a message to someone or to an entire congregation. This is accomplished by either one of two ways:

2nd The gift of tongues is used together with the gift of interpretation (1 Cor. 14:13,27,28).

- 3rd The gift of tongues is used and someone that hears the words spoken understands the language and, therefore, receives the message for themselves or a group of people. On the day of Pentecost, the gift was used first by those assembled to speak directly to God and not man (Acts 2:4). Then when others heard about this sign from God, they came and heard them speaking in their own language and understood the words as praise for "the wonderful works of God" (Acts 2:5-12).
- B. Even when there is no interpreter present, we can still speak out to God in Church. (:28)
- C. Two or three can speak in succession, and after an interpretation, more can speak out in tongues.

- D. The spirit of some one speaking in tongues is under their control. 1 Cor. 14:32
- E. Confusion exists in the hearts and minds of the unlearned who do not or who refuse to speak in tongues, not in those people who do speak in tongues.

- F. Women can speak out in tongues in Church and give a message. 1 Cor. 11:5
- G. These teachings are the commandments of the Lord! 1 Cor. 14:37
- H. If someone is ignorant of these truths after this instruction, he is willfully ignorant for his own selfish reasons.
